may be admitted on a regular admission basis to bachelor's degree programs. Students will normally be expected to sit for the ACT. However, in instances where students have taken the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SATI), these scores may be substituted for the ACT. SATs cores will be converted to ACT equivalent by using an appropriate conversion chart authorized by the Chancello of the Higher Education Policy Commission These students will not be required to take the ACT a later time.

Sincestudents' writing ability is an important indicator of successin University and may be used as a determinant in freshman placement in English composition courses, students are encouraged to complete the writing portion of the ACT or SATI and submit those scores for purposes of undergraduate admission.

2.3.1.Conditionaladmissiormay be granted in instances where GPA or ACT standards or regular admissiorare not met and institutional officials have evidence that the student has the potential to successfull complete University level work.

Studentswho do not meet the GPA or ACT standards but who demonstrate the potential to complete an undergraduate programmay be admitted conditionally with the following stipulations:

- 2.3.1.1.Studentmust complete the provisions of their conditional admission within the first three semesters of enrollment.
- 2.3.1.2.Conditionallyadmitted studentsmust achievea minimum of a 2.00 GPAin at least twelve gradedhours.

When all admissions tandards have been met, conditional status will be removed and the student will become a regular admission student.

- 2.3.2.GlenvilleStateUniversityhasthe discretionaryauthority to waive the Universitypreparatorycurricularrequirementsfor regularadmission.
 - 2.3.2.1.Studentsadmitted with a waiverunder the provisions of this sectionmust satisfy any of the curricular deficiencies through the successful completion of commensurate University course work. Each student receiving a waiverunder this provision must complete any commensurate course work prior to degree completion.
 - 2.3.2.2.Applicants or admission who have been out of high school for more than five (5) years or who meet institutionally established GED requirements may be

exemptedfrom the specified high school curricular requirements.

2.4. TransferStudents Students seeking transfer admission to Glenville State University must be academically and otherwise be eligible to return to the institution from which they wish to transfer and must meet the basic admission standards. Students who meet this requirement may be admitted, without conditions, upon the submission of an application for admission and an official transcript from ALL previous Universitys attended.

Studentswho do not meet the requirement listed above may be admitted to Glenville State University upon the recommendation of the Academic Appeals Committee. If, in the opinion of the Committee, such applicants can successfully complete an academic program, the Academic Appeals Committee may forward a recommendation to the Vice President for Academic Affairs that the student be admitted on probation for one semester Glenville State University.

- 2.4.1.Studentseekingadmissiorastransferstudentswho haveearnedfewer than 24 hours of Universitywork must also submit a high schooltranscript and ACT/SA scores as well as an official transcript from ALL previous Universitys attended. If the student does not have at least one of the following criteria:
 - 1.) 2.0 averageon their high schoolwork,
 - 2.) ACT composite of 18 or above,
 - 3.) A combined verbal/math SATs core of at least 820.

The student then must remediate all deficiencies before transferring into a Bachelor's degree program.

- 2.4.2. Studentswho transferto GlenvilleStateUniversityfrom another Universitymust have an overall GPA of at least 2.0 and a GPA of at least 2.0 on all coursework completed at GlenvilleStateUniversity as one of the criteria for graduation.
- 2.4.3. Students under disciplinary sanctionat a West Virginia public University or university at the time of the application for transfer admissionare also subject to other applicable rules of the University which may affect their admission to the University.
- 2.5. Non DegreeStudents.GlenvilleStateUniversitymayadmit studentson a non r degreebasis.Bydefinition, such students are not seeking and/or not eligible to pursue a certificate or degree at the institution.

Non degreeseekingstudentsmay enroll in those courses for which they are qualified. If a non degreeseeking student would later choose to pursue a degree program, that student must submit all required documents (test scores transcripts, etc.) to be admitted as a degree candidate.

Thenon degreeseekingstudentshallbe allowedto enroll in no more than seven(7) hoursper semester. The student will be responsible or paying the

All institutional admissionspolicies shall be submitted to the Higher Education Policy Commission for evaluation in terms of their compatibility with stated commission policies, institutional goals and available ducational programs and resources. Any amendments to admission policies shall be submitted to the Commission prior to their actual implementation at the institutional level.
