STUDENT POLICY 38

IMMUNIZATIONS

- 38.1. General
- 1.1. Scope. This policy promulgates policy and pedures regarding the required immunization of students enrolled at enville State University.
- 1.2. Authority: W.Va. Code 18B-1-6
- 1.3. Effective Date: April 19, 2006
- 1.4. Repeal of Former Rule Revises and replattles 131, Series 39 of the Board of Directors of the State University System which swansferred by the Higher Education Policy Commission to the institutional broads of governors. This policy persedes any or all previous GSU policies in reference to immunizations.

38.2. Background

2.1. Vaccine preventable diseases (VPDs) have declaramatically during the past 20 years as a cause of morbidity and mortality in the United 18s. While these declines have been dramatic, significant morbidity and some mortality from these VPDs persist. University-aged students remain susceptible to measles and rubella aeset bliseases continue to be associated with outbreaks on University campuses. During the repest, there have been numerous outbreaks on University campuses in the United States sounde deaths have occurred at an out-of-state University campus. In view of these circumstanded West Virginia State Director of Health requests that proof of valid measles and rabien munication be an enrollment requirement for students enrolling in West Virginia state colleges universities. In the interest of student health, the Glenville State University Board of Governors estas the following immunization policy.

38.3. Purpose

3.1. The primary purpose of a mandatory innization requirement for Glenville State University students is to prevent the introductiond apread of these vaccine preventable diseases among students at GSU. Accordingly, the squitzetions require proof of immunity as a requirement for enrollment at Glenville State Admissions Office shall administer the requirement as an aspect of the other and registration process.

38.4. Immunization Requirement

4.1. All students of Glenville Site University who were borafter January 1, 1957, except those exempted by this policy statement, shall be require provide proof of immunity to measles and rubella. To facilitate the implementation of this licy, the student shall be requested to provide proof of immunity on or before the date of eliment. The student shall have proof of immunity by the following semester or will not be permitted to enroll in classes.

4.2. In lieu of an immunization record signed apphysician, this requirements satisfied if					

38.7. Documentation

- 7.1. The acceptable proof of compliance would be cument which has been filled out and signed by a licensed physician. The document bull include the month, day, and year the vaccine was administered.
- 7.2. Acceptable proof may also be provided by thest Virginia high school attended. If Glenville State University receives official copy of a studenthealth record with report of immunization transmitted to GSU from a high school ted in West Virginia, this requirement is satisfied.
- 7.3. Each student will be asked to mplete and sign a form authroing the Admissions Office to forward a copy of the student's immunization rector the Campus Health Center for inclusion in the student's campus medical file.

38.8 Enforcement

- 8.1. The student shall be required to presembfpof immunity on or before the date of enrollment to the Admissions Office.
- 8.2. If a certificate of immunization is not receiven or before the date of enrollment, the University shall present a notice deficiency to the student. This tudent must have the required proof of immunity on or before the date of enrollent for the next semester or the student shall not be permitted to attend the school until the puired immunization, prof of immunity, or documentation of approved exemption has been provided.
- 38.9. Obtaining the Report of Immunity
- 9.1. The student shall be informed of this reception to by an Admissions Counselor of Glenville State University as an aspect the enrollment process.
- 9.2. The student and the University should mælæsønable effort to obtain proof of immunity from:
 - 9.2.1. The family physician or from appropriatecords signed by a physician or other community health provider.
 - 9.2.2. The West Virginia high school atteed. The health record with report of immunization from any high schoolWest Virginia shall be accepted as proof of immunization.
- 9.3. Glenville State Universityhsuld advise the student to restuthat the student's West Virginia high school health record be transmitted the time that the high school transmits the final official transcript of gades to the University. GSUnsuld also communicate with West Virginia high schools for this health record address to obtain official ranscripts of grades.

- 38.10. Obtaining and Administering Immunizations
- 10.1. Students who are unable to provide proof of immunity may obtain the required immunization free of charge.
- 10.2. The West Virginia Department of Healthdamounty health agencies in cooperation with state colleges and universities may putervihe immunization free of charge.
 - 10.2.1. Students may obtain the required immulicizaree of charge at any county health agency which administers immunizations.
 - 10.2.2. The State Health Department may **physicide** vaccine to the Campus Health Center free of charge upon request **ef Eh**irector of Campus Health Services.
 - 10.2.3. The Campus Health Center may admeinitatese vaccines only when a physician is in attendance. If vaccines are to to administered, the Capus Health Center must ensure that the student is advissed propriate medical ontraindications to the immunizations. The Campus Health enter attending physian should provide the medical exemption statement when appropriate.

38.11. Records and Reports

- 11.1. The University shall maintain file immunization records all persons not exempted from this requirement for immunity to meastered rubella. These records shall be open to examination by the State Department during normal business hours.
- 11.2. When a person transfers to another University niversity within the state system of higher education, the University shall, upon appriate request, send a copy of the person's immunization record at no cost the University or university to the person has transferred.
- 11.3. The University shall comply with any **ima**nization reporting requests from the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission.
- 11.4. The West Virginia Department of Hibrarian Human Resources may provide campus student health centers with official healthdammunization records folione purpose of recording immunizations which they might administer.
